

THE LOST ISLAND - ESCAPE ROOM

Tenses in practice - verb forms in context

B1/B2

The whole escape room is designed to give students extra practice of four basic tenses Present Simple, Present Continuous, Past Simple and Past Continuous. The set gives students the context for practice and shows them how they can be used. The set includes many text activities for students to complete as well as background story that students need to follow while going through the escape room. When students have completed the activity, ask them to report back or write a short summery of the story in order to reinforce the use of the verbs.

The story and the scenario

You were on a boat trip when a terrible storm hit, and your boat crashed on a desert island! The only way to escape is to build a raft and send a signal for rescue. To do this, you must find missing raft pieces, collect useful objects, and solve language challenges before nightfall!

Stranded on a Desert Island

The boat trip was supposed to be fun and relaxing. The sun was shining, and the sea was calm. But suddenly, dark clouds covered the sky. The wind became strong, and huge waves crashed against the boat. The storm was too powerful. You tried to hold on, but the boat tipped over, and everything went dark...

When you woke up, you were lying on a sandy beach. Pieces of the broken boat were everywhere. You looked around—there were no houses, no people, just trees and the sound of the ocean. You were on a desert island!

You need to escape before nightfall. The only way is to build a raft and send a signal for rescue. But some raft pieces are missing! You must explore the island, find useful objects, and solve language challenges to collect everything you need.

Time is running out. Can you and your team escape before it gets dark?

Task 5

The Rescue Signal

- Present Simple
- Present Continuous
- Past Simple
- Past Continuous

Example verbs:

• finds, is waiting, left, were running, appears, was watching, started, is walking, saw, are looking, shines, was building, cries, was searching, walks, went,

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Challenge 2: Gap-Fill Rescue Note

A distress message using the correct verb tenses.

Once the sentences are in order and the codeword is revealed, the rescue signal is complete, and the team escapes!

Items to collect:

The raft pieces - on completing every challenge the students receive a piece of a raft that they have to put together at the end.



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
