

Jobs Practice

A2/B1

The whole break-out room is designed to give students extra practice of names of the jobs, different attributes and qualities. All the challenges are designed to test ss' knowledge of job names but also the context. The ss get different exercises to understand instructions and practice job vocabulary skills. The ss solve each exercise and collect different skill badges. When they have finished, they're asked to pick the badge and the quality which best describes them. After completing a short text which describes their skills they get a certificate of completion and complete the game.

The instructions for each challenge appear after clicking the scientist and the activity opens when ss click the specified area in the challenge room.

The story and the scenario

"You've been accepted into the Career Academy, a top-secret international training program for students who want to become the next generation of real-world heroes — not superheroes, but teachers, doctors, designers, builders, engineers, and more. Over the past few weeks, you've studied many jobs. Now it's time for your Final Test.

Your mission is to enter the Career Simulation Lab — a series of virtual rooms where your knowledge of jobs will be tested. Tools are in the wrong places. People are saying the wrong things. Job skills are mixed up. To pass your final exam, you must:

Technical


