How to use the set

Speaking Trios is an interactive speaking game designed to get students talking about a wide range of familiar topics. The topics are based on the primary school curriculum and cover the main thematic areas introduced at different stages of primary education.

Students can decide which topic they want to talk about, giving them more choice and encouraging greater confidence and participation. Each of the three categories contains 30 different topics, giving 90 topics in total at each level. Topics are selected at random, so the activity can be reused many times with different combinations.

The set works well for whole-class speaking, pair work, small groups, warm-ups, revision lessons and conversation classes.

How it works

The main board contains three speaking categories. The teacher or students can click individual envelopes to reveal one topic at a time, or use the SHOW button to reveal all three topics together.

There are two ways to play:

1. **Open speaking** – students talk for as long as they need to complete the task.
2. **Timed speaking** – students have a limited amount of time to respond.

Encourage students to avoid one-word answers. They should explain their ideas, give reasons and examples, and add details whenever possible.

Use the RESTART button to reset the board and begin a new round.

Pick an envelope → reveal a topic → speak → explain and give examples → restart for a new round.

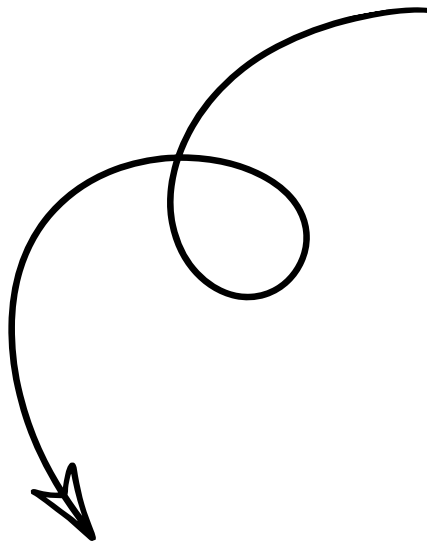
